They Get away with a Nice Little Sum, and Never Came Back

Calro, Ill., Nov. 11.-The Illinois Central train has been held up at Mayfield Bridge, Ky., eight miles south of here, by five masked men The robbers secured a small amount of cash and a viluable package, the contents of which are unknown. There is no clue to the perpetrators. The package is said to have contained fourteen hundred dollars. The robbers also robbed the pas sengers, getting but little, however, Bloodhounds have been sent from Paducah, Ky., to track th robbers.

The passengers were not disturbed. The robbery was so well planned that there was scarcely any excitement, Three men climbed the engine tank. One covered the engineer with a revolver and addressed him by his right name, saying, politely, "Mr. Clark, pull out as soon as you can." He told the engineer that he had no wish to hurt him, but would kill him if he disobeyed. Fireman Butler ran away and hid on the engine pilot. One of the robbers fired the engine like an old limer, from Bardwell to Port Jefferson. Here the engineer was instructed to stop the train at the Mayfield trestle. There the robbers sent the en gineer ahead of them at the point of the pistol and shot guns to the express car. Engineer Clark called to Messen ger McNeil to open the door as commanded by the robbers and the engineer told the messenger not to shoot the robbers using him as a target. The car was opened, and the robbers secured two packages of money, one of small amount and the other said to Something that Pickler Never Managcontain \$7,000. The messenger had hidden other valuable packages. The incidents of the holdup were so quick not aware of what was taking place abead. The robbers escaped.
