Although the democrats have a majority in the house and senate, any one who supposes that they will put through their new tariff bill without the liveliest kind of a fight will make a very large sized blunder. There will be strenuous opposition from the democratic side, and important interests which the bill threatens to anihilate are going to be heard from. In confirmation of this statement, it is only necessary to read the the expressions of opinion which have already been reported. The sugar manufacturing interests are decidedly of the opinion sugar would surely result in confirming stitute. the present monopoly in sugar making instead of crushing it out, as was evidently the purpose of the framers of the bill. The cutting down of the duty from fifty and sixty cents a hundred pounds to twenty-five cents will result in flooding this market with foreign refined sugar, and make it impossible to produce the article in this country at a profit. Refineries in opposition to the trust are springing up in various the wages of laboring men will be re duced. These are facts which cannot he explained away. They are familiar to those who are in the business; but the men who have framed this bill have shut their eyes to them. The tariff tinkerers favor the making of sugar in Germany, England, Scotland, and France, even if home manufactories are crippled. Germany pays a bounty on all refined sugar exported. and if the new tariff goes into effect, there will be an immense shipment of such sugar to this country. It will be impossible for our manufacturers tmeet this competition, because of the great difference between the price of labor in this and foreign countries,

Men who have invested large sum: of money in different industries are not going to sit down listlessly and see their fortunes crumble away under the baneful influence of the proposed tariff reform measure. The McKinley tariff took the duty off raw sugar and thu the price of this important commodiwas made lower, and all consumer were benefitted. The duty on foreign refined sugar was also reduced in ordthat no monopoly could raise the pric here without bringing in the foreign article as a sharp competitor. In the new tariff the duty on foreign refined sugar is cut down from 60 cents to ? cents per hundred pounds, which every one can see is a heavy reduction, and which men in the business say will result in a large part of the business of refining sugar being done in Europa should the bill become a law.

It is said Mr. Gladstone wanted, wher the house of lords threw out his home rule bill, to dissolve parliament and go to the country; but his partisans would not have it, and insisted substantially on dropping the Irish hot potato and holding office as long as possible.
