Fresno, Cal., Dec. 6.—The prosecution in the Evans case concluded its testimony this afternoon. The case will probably be closed this week.

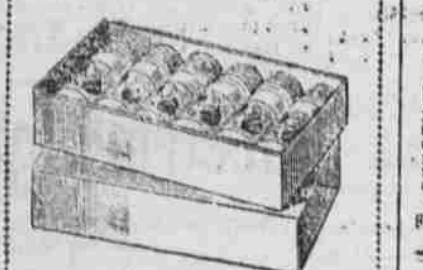
