(Continued from First Page.) strongly the desirability of free ruw materials, recommends an increase of ten cents per gallon on distilled spirits, and additional taxes on cigars and cigarettes, and new taxes on playing cards, cosmetics, perfumeries, legacies, successions, incomes from stocks and bonds of corporations, and joint stock

The secretary says much difficulty is experienced by officers charged with the duty of assisting in the enforcement of the Chinese exclucion laws by reason of certain practices resorted to by the Chinese coolie, "I am of the opinion," he says, "that as long as our laws prohibit the landing of Chinese laborers, the privilege of passing through our territory cannot be safely granted, and should at once be revoked. If this privilege be continued, it will be impossible to secure sufficient execution of the laws passed by congress for the exclusion of Chinese laborers.

On the subject of Pacific railways, the secretary says there are now outstanding \$64.623,512 of six-per-cent United States bonds issued in aid of Facific railroads. Congress should take action at this session with respect to the payment of at least \$2,362,000, which will mature within the fiscal year of 1895. Some plan should be adopted which will ascure the ultimate payment of the indebtedness to the government. and at the same time permit the companies to conduct their business under such limitations and restrictions as are necessary to protect the rights of all parties interested in the property. It would be very unfortunate if the government should be forced to operate these lines of railway.

CIFT TO STANFORD UNIVERSITY

San Francisco, Dec. 20.-Mrs. Jane Stanford, widow of the late Senator Stanford, confirms the report that the Leland Stanford Jr. University has received an endowment of \$360,000 from Thomas Weldon Stanford, of Melbourne Australia. The senator bequeathed the above amount to his brother.

Chicago, Dec. 20-Unofficial returns of yesterday's mayoralty election give Hopkins, democrat, a plurality of 1.141, The republicans are looking into the charges of fraud ,but no decisive steps have been taken yet to contest the re-Bult.

THE OREGON PACIFIC SALE.


