Objections to Eastern Men as Indian Agents in Oregon.

Washington, Jan. 5 .- There will be another contest in the senate over the confirmation of appointees from the Eastern states as Indian agents in the West. The fight will open with the Oregon appointment; and both Dolph and Mitchell have sald they intend to object to sending appointees from the East and south into their state. It is believed all Western men will support them. It is claimed by those who support the administration in the matter; that the Indian agencies are purely under federal control, and that appointees can be sent from any section of the country to government agencies.

No Separate Receiver Said to Have Been Asked For.

Omaha, Jan. 5 .- A rumor reached Omaha this morning that the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company had demanded a separate accounting with the Union Pacific, preparatory to the commencement of a suit looking to the appointment of a receiver for the northern line. Inquiry at headquarters failed to confirm the report, although a separate account of the net earnings is being kept to satisfy the second mortgage bondholders. Not the least fear is expressed at headquarters that the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company will follow in the footsteps of the Gulf Company.

#### REFUSED TO TALK.

San Francisco, Jan. 5.-The revenue cutter Corwin, from Honolulu, arrived in the harbor shortly after 12. All attempts of the reporters to get tidings from Hawaii from the Corwin were mei with a rebuff. The officers refused to hold conversation with any one. No one is allowed to board her, and no

papers were allowed to be passed off. The only thing in the way of new: from Honolulu which is known here as 2 p. m. is the statement said to have been made by a sailor on the Corwir to a reporter who tried to board the vessel and was repulsed, that there has been a big row down there. The state ment is not verified in any other way.
