A Date Fixed for a Vote on the Wilson Bill.

Washington, Jan. 8 .- The democrats succeeded in mustering a quorum in the house this morning. The demand for the previous question on taking up the tariff bill was carried-189 to none, ten more than a quorum. Thirty minutes' debate was allowed under the rules. The bank examinor discovered some irregularities Russell said he could explain. He disappeared Sunday afternoon. Investigation showed he had taken \$1000 with him. It was first thought he had left the country, but a drug clerk remembered having sold him an ounce of laudanum, and search was instituted cover \$10,000.


