LOGGING ON THY NEHALEM.

A party of loggers consisting of Hugh Frazier and four others came down the south fork of the Nehalem river from Mishawaka, thirty-five miles, with 150,-000 feet of fir and spruce logs, says the Nehalem Times, The logs were started during the freshet, and four men started behind them in a big flat-bottomed scow. They made the run from Frazier's place, a distance of twenty-five miles, in two and one-half hours. At the gorge the river narrows up and when they came through they report the water full thirty-five feet above the medium stage of water, and from the mouth of this gorge to the mouth of Salmon-berry river the water runs like a mill race, and they wished themselves ashore many times, but being experts they made the run in fine style. It is only at these extreme high freshets that a ride from the upper river is so exciting.
