A COLFAX MURDERER'S RECORD.

Colfax, Wash., Feb. 15.—In the superior court today George F. Parker, under arrest for the murder of A. B. Cooper at Pullman on the morning of October 17, was discharged, but immediately re-arrested on complaint of Sheriff Lathrum. He will have a preliminary examination tomorrow. The murder of Cooper was accomplished by a burglar, and Parker next day was arrested on suspicion. He was very reticent, and would tell nothing of his past history. The only clue was a pistol with which the murder was done, and a pair of burglar's nippers, which were found in the back yard of the hotel after the murder. Sheriff Lathrum had the accused man photographed, and the picture was recognized as that of an convict at the Oregon penitentiary, where he received a sentence under the names of Graft and Hillyard.

RUSSELL UNDER ARREST.

Springfield, Ill., Feb. 15.—Acting Gov. Gill today honored a requisition from Gov. Penneyer, of Oregon, for George F. Russell, wanted in Linn county, Ore. Russell was short in his accounts, and forged the name of Yost to cover his shortage. He is now under arrest at Bushnell, McDonough county, where he has wealthy and prominent relations.
