The light will imminate 183 degrees of the horizon, and will therefore be isine from all points along the coast within its geographical range.

The focal plane is 216 feet above mean aigh water, and the light may be seen n clear weather, the observer's eye 1. 'eet above the sea, 21 miles.

The light will be shown from a black antern surmounting a white conicar ower, about 50 feet high from base to ocal plane, with a white workroom atsched. Two oil houses, white, with nown roots, are located 50 feet and so eet, respectively, to the eastward of he tower. Two keepers' dwellings and a barn, each painted white, with brown .oofs, are located about 700 feet southasierly of the tower.
