ORDINANCE NO. 100.

An Ordinance Providing for Taxing, Licensing and Regulating Bars, Rooms and Drinking Shops and Places Where Liquors Are Sold Within the City of Astoria.

The City of Astoria does ordain as follows:
Section 1. That no person or persons shall, in the City of Astoria, Clatsop County, Oregon, either publicly or privately, in person or by another, sell, barter or deliver, or knowingly permit to be sold by another, or for or on his account, or otherwise, any wine, malt or spirituous liquors in less quantities than one gallon, or any other intoxicating liquor, except as herein provided.
