Ashley did not see any one take the money from his pockets, yet he feit certain that he had been despoiled in that

Captain of Police Holley made the arrest of Winnie Fox and Henrietta Marshall, and they were accompanied by the proprietor of the saloon, "Tony" Arnold. After listening to both sides of the story, Chief Hunt would not assume the responsibility of detaining the accused, unless Ashley swore to a complaint, which he did, including Arnold. The women have been residents here four years and Arnold has lived here 16 years, and this is the first time they have ever been arrested. They were at once released from custody upon furfifshing \$250 bonds each.

When those cases were called in the municipal court this afternoon, the prosecution asked for their continuance till Wednesday, because of Ashley's absence on business in Astoria, and such an order was made.
