ORDINANCE NO. 1899.

(As Amended) An Ordinance to Change the Names of Certain Streets Within the City of Astoria.

The City of Astoria does ordain as follows: Section 1. The streets within the City of Astoria running east and west, or in an easterly or westerly direction, and hereinafter called as they have heretofore been known and designated, shall be, and they are, hereby changed in name as follows:

- Concomly street, in McClure's, and First street, in Adair's, to Astor street. Chenamus street, in McClure's, and Second street, in Adair's, to Bond street. Summit avenue, in McClure's, and Summit avenue, in Shively's, to Niagara avenue.

Said streets and avenues shall hereafter be known and designated by the new or changed names, and not otherwise. Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed. Passed the Common Council April 24, 1894. Attest: K.
