(As Amended.) An Ordinance to Change the Names of Certain Streets Within the City of Astoria. The City of Astoria does ordain as follows: Section 1. The streets within the City of Astoria running east and west, or in an easterly or westerly direction, and hereinafter called as they have heretofore been known and designated, shall be and they are, hereby changed in name as follows:
