Voluntary arbitration is a correc method of settling labor troubles, because an agreement to arbitrate shows a disposition on both sides to make concessions, and when employed gener ally results in a peaceful solution of the controversy. But employers are not al ways willing to arbitrate labor differences, and for that reason voluntary arbitration is sometimes impracticable.


