TREATY RIGHTS IN COREAN AFFAIRS.

By the terms of the treaty entered into by China and Japan in the Tientsin convention of 1885, either of these nations was permitted, upon due notification to the other, to send forces into Korea to take part in the suppression of whatever disturbing cause might threaten the nation.

China has long held such a claim. Japan has for years been a leading factor in Korea's commercial life, her trade with the hermit nation exceeding China's even more largely than the number of Japanese in Korea exceeds the number of Chinese.

In the present outbreak of hostilities it appears that, whereas Japan manifested an intention to secure Chinese co-operation in suppressing the Korean rebellion, China sent her forces direct to Korea, not advising Japan of the step until after the soldiers were started on their journey.

The Sioux Falls public is having lots of service and lots of fun, and, so far from paying for either, it is positively economizing.
