A TERRIBLE LOSS. R. G. Dun Figures the Corn Loss at 500,000,000 Bushels.

New York, August 10.—R. G. Dun & Co.'s weekly review of trade tomorrow will say: The advance in corn discloses a general belief that the injury to this most important crop has been so great as to materially effect the traffic of railroads, the demand for manufactured products, and the cost of meats for the coming year.

SUITS AGAINST REINHART. New York, August 10.—Matilda Wallace has brought suits in the superior court of the city against J. W. Reinhart, president of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe, to recover \$53,000 damages.
