HANG ON TO YOUR BUTTONS. That is the Cry Among the People Sojourning at the Oregon Beaches.

There has been no mammoth whale tossed by the inward tide on the weather beach, says the Oregonian; no luckless white-winged messenger of commerce has been stranded on the sands of Clatsop's watery coast; but the 10,000, more or less, pleasure seekers at the season, and one that will discount all others of the past.

The one topic of conversation at Ocean Park, Long Beach, Ilwaco, and at Clasop Beach is "tidal wave," and the more it is talked about the bigger the story grows among those inclined toward credibility in things awful going to happen. Professor Falb, the Austrian earthquake and tidal wave prophet, is solely responsible for all the commotion. The professor has gained no little notoriety from former predictions he has made, some of them materializing so closely on the hour he stated as to have a startling effect. This is particularly true in regard to the earthquake at Charleston, South Carolina, a few years ago, and the recent Grecian earthquakes, and timid people there are who now place reliance in anything the astute Austrian may predict.

The great tidal wave that he has now foretold was first scheduled as due today, but since his first announcement. the professor has cast another horoscope and revised his dates so as to fix August 29 as the exact date for the great catastrophe. Whether or not the wave comes, it has caused considerable excitement at the seaside resorts. both on the Oregon and Washington consts. It is talked about around the driftwood fires at night; in the surf. while the bathers are disporting themselves in the briny waves and whitecapped breakers, while late at night the cautious camper takes a last look toward the western horizon to see if there is any portent of its coming beore turning in to sleep. In fact, the past few days the tidal wave has been in every one's mouth, figuratively speaking, and a number of persons with ultra-superstitious fears have left the seaside for home, their minds so wrought by stories of the coming cataclysm that they could not content themselves to stay and enjoy, with any comfort, the pleasures of their summer out-

There really seems to be no cause for niarm over the tidal wave prediction. A certain per centage of people will, of course, believe it is to happen, but the great majority are willing enough to take things as they come, borrowing no trouble these desperate times. The prophecy of Professor Falb, is that between August 17 and 39 a submarine earthquake will occur; New York city will be submerged by a great tidal wave; that the peninsula of Florida
