Washington, August 17 .- The Republians held a caucus this afternoon to consider the question of party action with reference to the free sugar and supplemental bills. The caucus lasted having accomplished a great deal. Senator Aldrich brought the question of of a Democrat on the finance committee, when Senator Pettigrew stated there was no need of discussing the subject, as there were eight Republicans who would agree to it as it would result in breaking up all the party discipline in the senate. That matter was then dropped. As to taking action of the filling of the vacancy, the general feeling was that no party action was necessary. A resolution of Senator Murphy that there be no further tariff legislation this session was discussed and it was decided that the Republicans would support it in a modified form, which would not specify tariff legislation, but would state that so near at an end, that it is impracticable to attempt to pass any contested session, and that it is the duty of congrees to adjourn as soon as possible. upon this resolution, it would secure enough Democratic votes to pass.
