The Hon. Charles Emory Smith, minister of the United States to Russia, says:

"Russia was our truest friend in the hour of our supreme trial. You know it from tradition; I know it from the archives. You know that in the critical period of the civil war, when we were threatened with English and French intervention, the Russian fleet appeared in the harbor of New York; I know the inspiration and the purposes which placed it within that protecting distance.

"Louis Napoleon, in an autograph letter, informed the Emperor Alexander of Russia that the French and English governments believed the time had come when they should interpose between the struggling combatants of the North and South, and besought Alexander to join in the movement, or, if he would not join, at least to pledge himself to remain passive. Alexander replied that the American people were fighting for the preservation of their Union, and of the government or their choice; that his sympathies were with them in their struggle, and that not only would he not join in the unfriendly movement, but in the event of such a movement, he would hold himself free to act as his judgment might dictate. And the Russian fleet, with flying flags and shotted guns, sailed into the Bay of New York and anchored within sight of Trinity spire. The world understood the significance of this act, and intervention never came."

The work at the jetty is progressing finely. Under the efficient administration of Superintendent Hegardt, and the trim little steamer Mendell, with Captain Brown in charge, is kept busy towing down the great barges of stone and transferring necessary supplies. About 1000 tons of first-class rock are now being placed in position daily, and the large force of selected men—among whom there does not appear to be a drone—moves with the celerity and precision of clock-work. It is doubtful if there is a larger or more important piece of public work in progress in the country than these improvements on the jetty, and it should be a source of much satisfaction that everything goes so smoothly, and that every dollar of money expended is used to the best possible advantage.

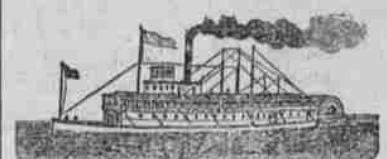
