Scribner's Magazine for November presents some interesting railway computations and tabulations covering the United States and England which are of great interest, showing the present extent, condition and revenues of the systems of both countries.

DUANE STREET GRADE NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria, propose to establish the grade of Duane street in the town (now city) of Astoria, Oregon, as laid out and recorded by John Adair, from the crossing of said street with 38th street and inclusive of the crossing with 38th street, at elevations above the base of grades for the city of Astoria, established by Ordinance No. 71, entitled, "An Ordinance establishing a base of grades for the streets of the city of Astoria, as follows, to-wit:

At the crossing of 36th street, 55.4 feet. At the crossing of 37th street, 55 feet. At the crossing of 38th street, 52 feet. The grade of said crossings to be level, and the street to be on a straight or even slope between the crossings and of equal height throughout the width of the street at any point.

DUANE STREET IMPROVEMENT NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria, Oregon, have determined to improve Duane street from the east side of 19th street to the west side of 12th street, (except the crossing of 11th street), all in the City of Astoria, as laid out and recorded by Cyrus Olney, by removing all defective piles, caps and stringers, and putting in new and sound fir piles, posts and sills wherever necessary, and new caps and stringers, and planing the same with good sound fir plank four inches in thickness, and by building sidewalks on both sides thereof; all of the improvements to be made to the full width and established grade of said street, and to include railings where necessary, and to be done in accordance with plans and specifications and ordinances in relation thereto.

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria, propose to establish the grade of Forty-second street in the town (now city) of Astoria, Oregon, as laid out and recorded by John Adair, from the crossing of Bond street to a point 170 feet south of the south line of Bond street at elevations above the base of grades for the streets as established by Ordinance No. 71, entitled, "An Ordinance establishing a base of grades for the streets of the City of Astoria," as follows, to-wit: At the south line of Bond street, 24 feet. At a point 150 feet south of the south line of Bond street, 25 feet. At a point 170 feet south of the south line of Bond street, 25 feet. The grade to be of even elevation throughout the width of the street, at any point and upon a straight or even slope or line between the points above designated.
