PROPOSAL FOR \$200,000 WATER BONDS OF ASTORIA, OREGON.

Sealed proposals addressed to the Clerk of the Water Commission of the City of Astoria, Oregon, will be received at this office until January 10th, 1895, at Two (2) o'clock p. m. for two hundred thousand (\$200,000) dollars of the bonds of this city in denominations of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars each, dated January 1st, 1895, payable thirty (30) years after date bearing interest at the rate of five (5) per cent per annum payable on the first days of January and July of each year.
