There are great gold strikes at Leadville. There is a "gold belt" at least three miles long. It is now certain that there will be more gold taken out of the sand and rocks, the mountains and the streams, in 1895, than ever in and the streams in 1895, than ever in the history of the ransacking of the earth for the precious yellow metal. It is coming from Russia to Australia, from South Africa to British Columbia, from Patagonia to California, and Colorado and Montana; and we do not doubt that there will be liberal contributions from Georgia and North Carolina. The greatest increase over old returns will be from South Africa and our Rocky Mountains. The demand for gold will be amply supplied; and that is the way to give silver a rise in the market.

The silver men have a notion that President Cleveland and his administration are not so much disturbed by the large gold withdrawals, which are continuing, as they would seem to be. They think that Mr. Cleveland considers these withdrawals as an object lesson to congress, and has hopes that they will prove educational in making evident the necessity for some action to prevent the continual presentation of legal tenders for redemption and their immediate re-issuance.

PROPOSAL FOR \$200,000 WATER BONDS OF ASTORIA, OREGON. Office of the Water Commission of the City of Astoria, Oregon.

Sealed proposals addressed to the Clerk of the Water Commission of the City of Astoria, Oregon, will be received at this office until January 12th, 1895, at Two (2) o'clock p. m., for two hundred thousand (\$200,000) dollars of the bonds of this city in denominations of one thousand (1,000) dollars each, dated January 1st, 1895, payable thirty (30) years after date bearing interest at the rate of five (5) per cent per annum payable at the first days of January and July of each year.

These bonds are to be issued under authority of the act of the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon passed Feb. 18th, 1891. The proceeds are to be used for the construction of water works, and will be delivered with coupons attached for interest from January 1st, 1895.
