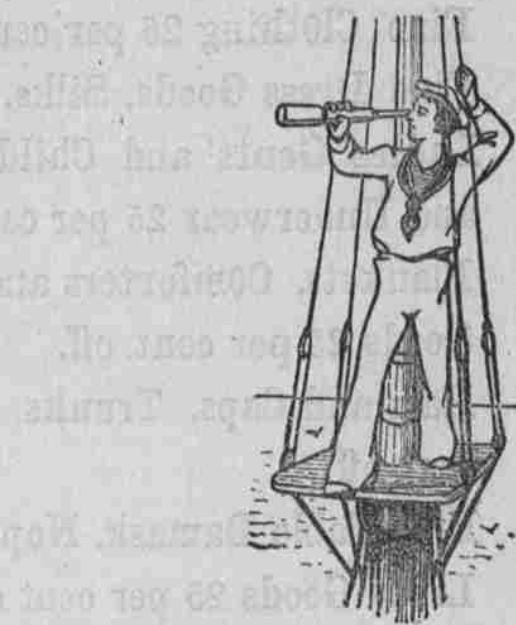

Oregon's Great Seaport.

The prediction of shrewd old John Jacob Astor is about to be fulfilled. The city of Astoria, Oregon, is about to become the greatest seaport and metropolis of Northwestern America.
