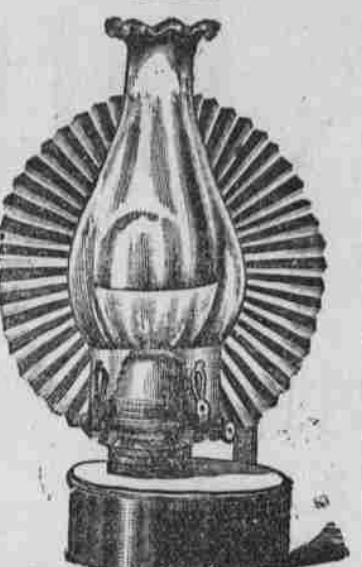

## Oregon's Great Seaport.
