NOTICE OF INTENTION OF COUNCIL TO RE-ESTABLISH GRADE OF PART OF 15TH

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria have determined and intend to alter the grade of 15th street in the part of the city laid out and recorded by J. M. Shively, from the south line of Exchange street to the north line of Franklin avenue, as follows, to-wit: At the south line of Exchange street, 30 feet. At the north line of Franklin avenue, 30 feet.

At the north line of Grand avenue, 45 feet. At the south line of Grand avenue, 45 feet.

The street to be of the heights mentioned throughout the width thereof, and the slope thereof to be on a straight or even line between said points.

At any time within ten days from the final publication of this notice, to-wit: within ten days from the 18th day of April, 1905, remonstrance can be made against said proposed grade, and if within said time a written remonstrance against the same shall be made and filed with the Auditor and Police Judge, by the owners of three-fourths of the property adjacent to said portion of said street, such proposed grade shall not be made in any event.

FIFTY-FIFTH STREET IMPROVEMENT NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria, Oregon, have determined to improve Fifty-fifth street in the part of the city laid out and recorded by J. M. Shively, from the north line of Commercial street to the north line of Irving avenue, as follows, to-wit: Commencing at a point where the west line of Lot 3 in Block 135, if extended northerly would intersect said line, and thence westerly, and thence southerly on a straight line to a point where the west line of said Lot 3, in Block 135, if extended northerly, would intersect the north line of Commercial street, and thence easterly on the north line of Commercial street to the place of beginning.

All land, real estate and premises within said described limits of said district and not included in any street, are to be subject to such assessment as benefited by such improvement.

Estimates of the expense of such improvements and plans and diagrams of such work or improvement and of the locality to be improved have been deposited by the City Surveyor with the Auditor and Police Judge for public examination, and may be inspected at the office of such officer.

At the next regular meeting of the Common Council following the final publication of this notice, which meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 13th, 1905, at the hour of 7:30 p. m., at the City Hall, any objections that may be made to such proposed improvement will be considered by the council, and if by the time of said meeting a remonstrance against such improvement signed by residents of the city owning more than one-half of the property in said district shall be filed with the Auditor and Police Judge, such improvement shall not be ordered, if at all, except by a vote of two-thirds of all members of the council.
