### AMONG THE CHURCHES.

Easter Sunday Saw Every Church With a Large Congregation.

In the Various Churches the Music Was Excellent and the Decorations Beautiful.

At no church festival is the subject of music considered of so great importance as at Easter. Not even on Christmas is there greater attention paid by the different churches to the character of the music rendered at the various services. Elaborate programs are always furnished by the Catholic and Episcopal churches, but Sunday the churches of Astoria, irrespective of denomination, made great preparation for Easter services, and the various churches were decorated beautifully with sweet-scented flowers, Easter lilies predominating. Likewise all denominations make a special effort to present good music on Easter. In this city some of the choirs were augmented for the occasion, and some of them had the assistance of an orchestra in addition to the organ. This was especially true of the Catholic church yesterday.

At the first M. E. church, the Presbyterian, Episcopal, Congregational and Baptist, especially fine musical programs had been prepared. Their rendition added greatly to the impressiveness of the services and imbued the congregation with a higher devotional sentiment. The character of the music on Easter is, of course, of the most joyous character, for it typifies the risen Christ and the completion of the divine scheme of salvation. It is in great contrast with the sombre and wailful chants that are sung during holy week in the Episcopal and Catholic churches.

Astoria is fortunate in possessing a large number of excellent singers who are heard in the different choirs, and so there is no composition too difficult or intricate to be given a proper interpretation by Astoria church choirs.

As usual the churches were more crowded Easter Sunday than on other festival days. The sermons, as was to be expected, were of exceptionally high order, and did not fail to impress upon the congregation the great lesson of the day.

### THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN.

Appropriate Services of a Most Attractive Character.

The Easter evening services at the First Presbyterian church were unusually well attended, every seat in the building being occupied, and a few of those present being compelled to stand throughout the service.

The church, thanks to the kindness of members of the congregation, was most beautifully decorated with a profusion of lilies, palms, azaleas, and other choice flowers and plants. Prominent among the decorations was a cross, artistically formed of lilies which had been sent to Mrs. H. C. Thompson by relatives in California. Of the large number present some few non-members of the congregation were attracted by the promise of a splendid musical program, and not one was disappointed, for seldom have Astorians listened to music of a higher order within the portals of a church. Among the soloists Mrs. J. T. Ross deserves special mention for her masterly rendition of "Easter Dawn," the mellow tones of her sympathetic contralto were never heard to better advantage, while her correct enunciation of the requirements of the piece left nothing to be desired. The choir had thoroughly mastered the hymns, and the several voices blended to perfection. Mrs. C. W. Fulton, the leading soprano, was not heard in a solo, but her full, sweet and flexible voice among the choirs was a most important factor in making the program the prominent success which it undoubtedly was. A short but eloquent sermon brought the services to a close, and it may be said with safety that a goodly proportion of those who attended before they left the sacred edifice, echoed the thought, "It is good for us to be here."

At the next regular meeting of the Common Council following the final publication of this notice, which meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 17th, 1895, at the hour of 7:30 p. m., at the City Hall, any objections that may be made to such proposed improvement will be considered by the council, and if by the time of said meeting a remonstrance against such improvement signed by residents of the city owning more than one-half of the property in said district shall be filed with the Auditor and Police Judge such improvement shall not be ordered, if at all, except by a vote of two-thirds of all members of the council.

### BOND STREET IMPROVEMENT NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria, Oregon, have determined to improve Bond street with less or low than the street to the west line of 4th street all in the city of Astoria as laid out and recorded by John Adair, by grading to the full width of said street and by raising the same to a grade of 3 feet above the established grade and by planing such part of said street that is to be a grade with less or low than 3 feet in thickness to the width of 20 feet through the center of said street and by laying sidewalk 10 feet wide on each side thereof, and by planing, capping and planing the north half of so much of said part of said street as is a tide land or of a width of less than 20 feet as to the established grade thereof, and by laying sidewalk 10 feet wide on the north side, railings where necessary, all to be done in accordance with plans and specifications and ordinances in relation thereto.

The lands and premises upon which the special assessment shall be levied to defray the cost and expense of such improvements and the district embracing said lands and premises, be and the same are designated as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the southeast corner of Block 6, in the part of said city laid out and recorded by John Adair, and running thence east on the west line of said Block 6, and thence south on the west line of said Block 7, and thence west on the west line of Block 7 and the west line of Block 8 to the southwest corner of said Block 8, and thence easterly to the south line of Block 8 and 9, to the southeast corner of Block 9, and thence northerly on the east line of Block 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, to the northeast corner of said Block 10, and thence westerly on a straight line from the north east corner of Block 10, to the north west corner of Block 11, and thence southerly on the west line of Block 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16, to the place of beginning, and all lots and blocks and other property contained within said district and not included in streets already improved and may be improved and used to such assessment.
