The Tin Market Glutted.

It will be interesting to note in connection with the salmon industry the peculiar and unusual fluctuations in the quoted prices of tin plate during the next few months. It will be a condition brought about mainly owing to the general belief that the British ship Cupica, with 30,000 cases of tin plate aboard consigned to local cannermen, had foundered at sea.
