Yesterday afternoon the Signal came down from Portland with a full cargo of flour for China via Vancouver. She will take back the Celestials who have n refused a landing on this side.

The stevedore's office has caught the ampirit of the times and corpenters were busy yesterday in Scott Johnson's sanctum putting in a new door and otherwise embellishing the front of the establishment. Spring is coming.

The Ancona, with 4,000 tens of cargo, was brought down the river yesterday morning by the tugs Ocklahama and Emma Hayward, with Pilot Pease in command. She lightered 1115 bags of wheat as soon as she reached her anchorage. Captain Ellis expects to leave out tomorrow.

One of the most precious sea log-books extant was recently exhibited at the Merchant's Exchange, Sydney, It was Capitain Cook's official log of the cruise of his majesty's ship Endeavour, and covers the period from May 25th, 1768, to October 23d, 1770. The book was purchased by F. H. Dan-gar and presented to the Sydney Mu-

The British bark Mozambique, 2305 cons, Captain McCrone, arrived in yesterday, 28 days from Santa Rosalia, in bailast. The captain reports that he was off the bar seven days ago, but beut up to Cape Flattery by reason of southeast winds. The trip was a fair one with very little bad weather. The Mozambique is a fine vessel built by Russell & Co., of Glassow, the designers of the Ancora. She is heavily manned and carries 37 all told.

The beginning of an important era was mangurated in the history of the Sarely Hook pilots last week when they petitioned the New York Pilot Commissioners to allow them to replace their twenty-one saling craft with two or more steamers for that important service. The New York pilots also requested the privilege of combining with the New Jersey pilots in the new departure. The pilots claim that eighty per cent of their number favor the change from sall to steam. If it is true that this large per centage of pilots believe that the time has arrived to change their old established methods of serving the shipping of the port of New York to keep abreast of the times, there is little doubt that it is the correct thing to do.

The bark Senoma sailed for Nanaimo on Monday from San Francisco to load cosi for the whaling fleet in the Arctic occan. She had a crew aboard that signed for the voyage at \$39 a month, and she was scheduled to leave early. They were all non-union men, but some of the pickets of the union appeared among them and induced them to demand \$35 per month. The captain would not listen to them, and when they refused to work he ordered them ashore. Ouce on land no boarding house master would give them shelter. Some of them went back to the vessel and endeavored to regain their berths, only to be told that wages had fallen to \$25 since they left. A couple of the men accepted the reduced wages, and the crew was filled by Japanese and negroes.


