Such was the extent to which the country had been blinded by the bluster and clamor of the silver advocates, that it has been impossible to pick up any tabulated sum mary or estimate of the strength of free colinage in the next national convention without finding Oregon classed in the silver column. There has never been a doubt in the minds of deliberative and cool-headed Republicans that the proposition favoring free silver would be overwhelmingly defeated whenever squarely presented to any party assembly in the state. It was so presented and forced on the Portland meeting by short-sighted men in the aliver contingent, with the consequence that Oregon will now be transferred from the sinte-maker's silver column to the ranks of the reliable and enlightened states of the Union. It devalved upon Oregon last year to fire the first gun and carry the first battle in o campaign which culminated in the greatest aggregated victory for the Republican party ever achieved by any political organization in the history of the country, and it is again her distinction to be the first state to confront and overthrow the free silver heresy in a con on of Republicans. The promptne and decisiveness of Wednesday's action will encourage the defenders of hones money throughout the Northwest, and Oregon Republicans will be commended in this city, have placed their affairs and praised from one end of the country

The constitution provides for a school system that is comprehensive, and if well carried out will give the new state a high rank in educational matters. The success of the commonwealth will depend largely on the dominant spirit that will control it. Woman suffrage will mean in Utuh what it means in no other state, and that is the supremacy of the church in political affairs. The population of the territory in 1800 consisted of 110,463 males and 97,442 females, or a total of 207,905. The membership of the Mormon church is 14,000, of which nearly the entire number are in Utah. This would give the Mormon church the absolute control of the state, especially with the franchise of suffrage extended to the sen of that church.

The statement that the gain in population from immigration to the United Stistes last year was only 1,606, if it be true, shows that the restrictions upor immigration have been effectual. It is said that 312,778 steerage pussengers of foreign birth left this country for Europe last year, and that dis,407 gained entrance to our ports.
