CHANGES IN PRICES AND WAGES.

Secretary Carlisle's speech to the Souns Money Convention at Memphis contained the course of prices and wages of labor in the United States during more than half a century. Mr. Carlisle was a mem ber of the senate sub-committee which investigated this subject, and therefore speaks with authority as to its conclusions. He said the committee selected 222 articles in common use, which it was agreed constituted the bulk of the con sumption and expenditures of the people and separated these into eight classes o groups. It has found that for 1892 the prices of articles used for food, taking them altogether, had fallen less than 10 per cent since 1873, while the prices of clothes and clothing had fallen 22 per cent, fuel and light nearly 24 per cent, metals and implements 35 per cent, lum ber and building materials nearly 20 per cent, drugs and chemicals 31 per cent, house furnishing goods 27 per cent, and miscellaneous articles 10 per cent.

At the time the investigation was made,

in 1892-93, articles of food stood nearly 4 per cent higher than in 1860, clothes and clothing 19 per cent lower, fuel and lighting 9 per cent lower, metals and implements 25 per cent lower, lumber and er, house-furnishing goods 30 per cent lower, and miscellaneous 5 per cent lower. The results of the investigation establish three facts which have important bearing on the contention of the free silverites. The prices of articles of food which are the product of farms, gardens, orchards, and dairies of the country, were 4 per cent higher than in 1800, long before the prices of the commodities the farmers to particular articles or groups of anticles. Therefore they cannot be attributed to one and the same cause—to the appreciation of gold, for instance,

Coston and wheat are the commodities most frequently referred to by those who contend that the fall in prices is due to the appreciation of gold, but there is nothing in the methods of producing those articles, or in transporting or selling them, which would make the "appreciation of gold" affect the prices of other commodities produced by our people. Both have been seriously affected by the enormous increase in their production since 1872, which was the last crop year preceding the legislation in regard to silver. The production of cotton in 1896-'54 was nearly three times that of 1872-73, and the wheat crop of 1894 nearly twice as much, while there has also been an enormous increase of production in competing countries. (And the prices of both

The one thing that has been less affected by the changes in the relation be- Rogers. tween supply and demand, by improvements in the methods of production and distribution, and by the other influences that cause fluctuations in prices of commodities generally, is labor; and it is by far the most important single source of income possessed by our people. The cost of labor in the manufacturing and mechanical industries for the census year 1889 was 2,283 million dollars, nearly two and a balf times the value of all the wheat and collon produced in the counpaid for farm labor and for the many pills.
