Secretary Carlisle's speech to the Sound Money Convention at Memphis contained a most important statement in regard to the course of prices and wages of labor in the United States during more than half a century.

The statement made on good authority that within the past six weeks the wages of 20,000 employes of manufacturing establishments in the United States have been raised, in most cases by the voluntary act of the employer, is another substantial assurance of better times.
