"From fishermen it is learned that the salmon run this year has been the smallest for many seasons. A few Chinooks have been caught, but silver-sides and steelheads have not put in an appearance yet. There has not been enough salmon caught to supply the local demand, and the canneries have had little or nothing to do."
