A WORD TO PARENTS.

We wonder, sometimes, how many parents realize to how great an extent the moral character and the habits of thought as well as the opinions of their children are influenced by the home newspaper which comes into the family and is read from beginning to end by every member of it.

Would you want such a man to be your child's most intimate and influential friend? If not, then don't want the paper that is his conspurator.

No child should be allowed to read a paper that is not clean and courageous and hopeful and patriotic.
