SHIPPING DAY BY DAY

Marine Matters, Here, There and Everywhere.

The steamer Elmore left out for Tillamook yesterday morning, with a full cargo of freight.

The painting of the Galgate has been completed and men were busy yesterday rigging her raised main letters.

The work on the Lucero's engines is now finished. Tomorrow she will make a trial trip round the bay and her machinery will be thoroughly tested in other ways before she is passed on as completely repaired.

The State of California left out for San Francisco yesterday morning with over 300 passengers who evidently believe that, with the present rates for travel, they are getting their money's worth. The State had a full cargo.

The bark Nellie Troop reached New York November 15th after a passage from Manila, Luzon, one of the Philippine Islands, occupying 20 days, or four months longer than is usually needed. Captain Young took the Cape of Good Hope route and was one month in rounding the cape.

The steamer Belgic, of the Occidental and Oriental Company's line, will not be ready to go out on her schedule time next month, says the Call. After she was hauled off the beach near Volokha, she went to Hongkong for repairs. These are not completed, so it will be next January before the well-known liner gets back to San Francisco. The tramp steamer Evandale, which took the Belgic's place, has proved to be too slow, and will not be again in San Francisco. Her place for the December trip will be taken by the Alfrida, a new 12-knot vessel that can carry 6,000 tons of freight and has good passenger accommodations. The Belgic will leave Hongkong on December 6, and will arrive in San Francisco about the first of the new year. Captain Kinder, who has succeeded Captain W. H. Walker, will bring the Belgic out.

A veritable case of shipping coals to Newcastle is being discussed among local coal men. During October an upprising Seattle dealer made two shipments of Gilman coal to Victoria, one consignment consisting of 500 tons. The Victoria people, it is reported, began buying the Washington product at once, endeavoring thereby to get even with the British Columbia coal combine which is supposed to make a very large profit on the coal it handles. About the time the first consignment of Gilman coal had been used up and the second one ordered, the alleged combine cut prices to an extent that induced the Victorians to again use the home product. Local men say the prices will remain down until the Seattle dealer forces out of business on foreign soil and then go up to the old schedule. Local dealers would like to see the American win, as the reduction of the tariff on coal by the Wilson bill has allowed British Columbia coal to cut into the Coast trade more than ever, particularly in San Francisco.—Toucan Lodge.

The Canadian Gazette (London) of the 13th ult., contains the following article under the caption "Salmon not Trout?" "We are glad to be able to announce that after scientific investigation the Fishmonger's Company has removed the prohibition it placed upon the sale of British Columbia salmon in this market. The question was whether those British Columbia salmon were really of the salmon species, and so admissible for sale during the British salmon close season, or whether they were trout, the sale of which—whether British or foreign trout—is absolutely prohibited by the act of October 1887. The question was submitted to one who is probably the highest authority on salmon, Dr. Gunther, who has for forty years been connected with the science department at South Kensington, and his report is as follows: "I beg to inform you that the fish from the Fraser river has safely reached me, and that I have examined it today. Although the fish belongs to the family Salmonidae, and was often by the name of 'California Salmon,' it is widely different from our own salmon (Salmo salar) from our migratory sea trout (Salmo trutta, S. caudatus, etc., etc.) and from our fresh water trout. "All these fish belong to the division Salmo, which the California salmon belongs to the division Oncorhynchus, which division has no representative in European waters—or, indeed, in any water running into the Atlantic. The fish belonging to Oncorhynchus live in waters running into the Pacific. The particular specimen which you have sent me is undoubtedly genuine, and which species it agrees in all external and internal characters. "The name 'Sockeye' is a corruption of an Indian word, and is applied to several species of the Pacific coast of North America. "That opinion at once set the question at rest, and caused the Fishmongers' Company to remove its prohibition, so that the sale of fish is now proceeding as before.

with no interval to speak of, would carry more grain in a day than a quadruple track railway. This would constitute a sort of grain pipe line. The Commercial Advertiser also points out the probable abolition of street cars before the coming horseless carriage, which can be operated by a boy on a small pavements at a total expense for labor, oil and interest of less than 10 per day.
