SHIPPING DAY BY DAY

Marine Matters, Here, There and Everywhere.

The German bark Albert Rickmers, fully laden, was taken out from the city of Astoria, Oregon, by Pilot Johnson and dropped in the stream, taking the anchorage just vacated by the Rowena.

The British bark Powys Castle, with an Oregon pilot aboard was towed into port by the Relief yesterday at noon. She is to be chartered to load wheat for an Irish port. She leaves up the river tomorrow.

The British ship Galgate has at last secured a charter, though not for what her captain had ordered yesterday to proceed at once to Port Maitland, on Puget Sound, and last Monday for an Australian port. The Galgate will go to sea tomorrow. She will probably be towed around to the Sound.

The State of California left out for San Francisco yesterday morning, with 400 passengers, 154 of whom were in the cabin. As has become customary since the low rates were made in London, the board had return tickets and will be back in Oregon within fifteen days. Several Astoria people are making the trip.

The British ship Rowena was towed down to Fort Stevens by the Relief and Escort yesterday. She will leave out for Palmyra this morning. Captain Reed just before leaving made a wager of \$100 with Captain George Warnock, of the German bark Albert Rickmers, that he would beat him to London. People along the water front believe that the German has the best of the wager, for though the Rickmers' bottom is very foul, she is a superior built vessel, and her skipper is a man who knows how to get every inch out of his ship.

The British bark Invernauld which is now on the way from Newcastle, N. W., to San Francisco, had a lengthy passage from London to Newcastle this trip. She reached the equator in thirty days after leaving London, and then carried by a strong current took to the Brazilian coast and then had to go north again, crossing the line and finally recrossing it on her fifty-seventh day out. Off the Cape of Good Hope her ballast shifted, causing a further delay and a seaman was lost in the process. On the days on the trip and before her arrival 70 guineas per cent was paid on her as an overdue ship.

The British ship Indian Empire, bound from Newcastle, N. W., to San Francisco, put into Callao November 21 when she was 107 days out and the captain sent home the following cablegram: "Ship was on beam to-day. The crew, the masts, yards, sails and rigging carried away; lost main and cross jacks, spunker boom and ribboom, three boats, side of deck house stove in, foremast damaged, cabin gutted. Ship's papers saved; lazaretto gutted; jettisoned cargo to extent of 100 tons. Time on seaward board. Waiting instructions." When the news arrived at Liverpool ninety guineas per cent had been paid to effect insurance on the vessel. The cargo of condemnation still existed forty guineas per cent was paid on her that day.

Tuesday night's storm, though its violence was little felt in Victoria, says the Colonist, was wild enough on the water, and ill-fared any small craft forced to fight it. One of the boats, a white fishing sloop, apparently from Victoria, the wreck of which was discovered when morning broke yesterday, only about twenty yards from the operator's house at Otter point. She was then hauled up and her stern altogether under water and her sails showing at times. No name could be made out, nor anything to specially distinguish the craft which was about thirty feet long and had evidently sprung during the previous night while running before the storm. Of the men who had formed her crew nothing could be learned, and the only conclusion Mr. Gordon could draw from the circumstances of the wreck was that they had lost their lives. All day yesterday the gale continued so strong that every effort to reach the wreck was abandoned. The name and number of the unfortunate sloop must remain unknown, until today at least. The wind, which continued to blow from the north, will in a few hours more dash the wreck upon the beach. When last seen yesterday evening the sloop was of water, and lying on her side her stern to the shore.

An interesting discussion has been raised in the North American Review by Mr. Austin Corbin, a New York banker and millionaire, in respect to quicker transit between New York and London, the two commercial centers of the world. Nothing is more evident than that hours and sometimes even minutes become of the highest importance to men engaged in great business transactions comprising both continents, and that the telegraph cannot take the place of mail and express service. Therefore it is that business men everywhere are considering ways and means for reducing the time of communication between Europe and America. It is now pretty certain that the ocean flyers are accomplishing about as fast as is possible in their race against time, and as far as steam navigation is concerned, with such machinery as can now be devised, the limit of speed has been reached. Taking such a vessel as the Lusitania, her average time is six days and a half, though of course she has made a day's better time on occasion, but the average, taking the year round, is what is to be counted on, and it is not likely that there will soon be built a better or swifter vessel than this Lusitania. How then can the time between the countries be reduced? Mr. Corbin answers the question by proposing a shorter route so far as the ocean voyage is concerned.
