There are twines sold to fishermen on the Columbia river that stand in the same relationship to Marshall's Twine as a wooden image does to the human being-they lack strength-life -evenness-and lasting qualities. Don't fool yourself into the belief that other twines besides Marshall's will do "just is well." They won't. They cannot.
