SHIPPING DAY BY DAY

Marine Matters, Here, There and Everywhere. The steamer Empire sailed for this city yesterday from San Francisco via Coos Bay. The Japanese cabin boy of the schooner Fawn is a patient in hospital for some little time—the result of his having dined on canned salmon that had "gone bad."—Continued. The lumber schooner Huenama, which was towed to Sand Island by the Reelief at a late hour Friday night, was brought up to Parker's dock yesterday morning. She will leave up for Portland after discharging sand ballast. The steamer Carina has put into Rio de Janeiro with her machinery out of order. She was purchased by the John D. Spreckels Bros. Company to carry coal from Marshfield and was on her way to San Francisco from Pensacola, Fla. There were no movements of any kind along the waterfront yesterday. Nothing went up to Portland and nothing came down. During the morning both the Reelief and Escort went as far as Fort Stevens. Nothing was reported outside during the day. The weather yesterday got very stormy and during the afternoon and evening the wind at the mouth of the river reached a velocity of seventy-five miles. The helping men prophesied bad weather for several days to come, and that being the case, there is no favorable outlook for any of the loaded vessels in port getting away. The schooner James A. Gardiner from Gray's harbor lost a man overboard during the gale that proved so disastrous to the steamer Noya. It was in latitude 49 deg. 18 min. north, long 125 deg. 53 min. west, and a heavy sea swept over the vessel and carried Louis Williams overboard. An attempt was made to lower a boat, but it was smashed into small pieces against the schooner's side. Some of the finest specimens of the toothsome Tye salmon are now being caught by local fishermen in Camanche Bay, says the Tacoma News. The fish hit well along the wharves and it is not necessary to row across the bay to enjoy the sport. The bait used is a small herring on a plain hook treed behind a rowboat. This is one of the best seasons known here for the Tye variety of salmon. The British bark Sharpshoot, which was wrecked in the Gulf of California, is towed to San Francisco by the tug Force, was sold at public auction Wednesday by the United States marshal. Bidding was lively and finally the hull was knocked down to J. Johnson for \$2,300. It is understood that the purchase was for A. Lentzsen & Co., and that the Sharpshoot will be refitted and put in the Hawaiian trade. Owing to the delay in getting orders and the risk of so long a detention in port nearly all of the American steamers will go out under the British flag this season. Among those now fitting out and which will probably be the case are the schooners Erna and Louise, Lily L., and Edward E. Webster. Their owners say they are not going to risk failure on their return to port and will put in the same box as the Bowhead and the Sophie Sutherland.—Examiner. The British ship Duntrun changed her anchorage slightly yesterday in front of Placer's dock. Harbor Master Phil Johnson went out to the ship during the afternoon and she was brought in to clear to the wharves by means of a kedje anchor, and a changing line. Her anchors got badly snubbed up, however, during the operation. The Duntrun's last passage out was commented on generally along the waterfront yesterday. Her trip for this time of the year was remarkably fast one. The bark McNear, which arrived from Departure Bay yesterday, says the Chronicle, had a lively time of it outside, and her owners are going to have an equally interesting time in port. From Puget Sound it took the vessel thirty-four days to get to San Francisco, and during that time she has been in almost every storm that has raged along the coast since last December. She was driven back again and again, and had it not been for Captain Pederson the men would have taken command and run the vessel back to Port Townsend. All day yesterday the pilots in the city and a great many others, were anxiously awaiting further news from Victoria or Port Angeles regarding the vessel anchored inshore on the coast, and during the day several telegrams passed between shipping men here and on the Sound. Up to a late hour, however, no satisfactory news had been obtained. It is very questionable whether the vessel is in the Cadzow Forest, and most of the pilots believe that it is not. They cannot see how she could possibly have got into the locality described. The head of the supply department of the United States navy has decided to make a recommendation that another
