TRAIN DERAILED FOR FUN

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29.—The presentation of the committee reports on Cuba and the highly dramatic and sensational speech of Tillman, senator from South Carolina, furnished today the majority resolution on Cuba asks the president to urge Spain to grant biller rights to the insurgents, while the minority report directs the president to take steps toward securing from Spain the complete independence of Cuba.
