The British ship Airlie, 1429 tons, Cap-tain Caines, which called from Port Los-Angeles January 2, arrived in port yes-terday after a quick and uneventful pas-sage. She has a part cargo, 700 fons of general merchandise, which is consigned to Taylor, Young & Co.

The shipping now on the way to As teria represents 42.574 tons, divided among the different ports of departure as follows New York, 3,51; Antwerp, 1,770; Callao, 1,068; Calcutts, 2,631; Grimsby 1,986; Mamburg 2,584; Liverpool, 5,235; Manatian, 1,385; Maryport, 1,29; Newcas-ile, N. S. W., 10,833; Pisagua, 832; Val-paraiso, 1,070. At the same time in 1955 the total on the way amounted to 25,812 tons; in 1894 it was but 11,368 tons.

This is an unusually large shipment for coastwise points, and its significance is not entirely understood here. Some think there is a grain shortage in California, induced probably by too free shipments to Australia. Captain Gage is at present commanding the Walla Walla, Captain Wallace being East. On the trip up, to avoid the head winds blowing down the coast, the vesses kept very close inshore, giving the passengers i good opportunity to see the scenery along the ocean beach,—Tacoma Ledger.
