Be that as it may, Captain Doig is to be congratulated for getting the Bedfordshire to sea.

The Pacific Mail Company's steamer Zealandia arrived from Panama and way ports last evening, considerably behind her schedule time. Her delay was due to the fact that she had considerable freight on board to be delivered at way ports. Last night she passed the over-due steamer San Juan, which left some days ahead of her, off Point Conception, While the Zealandia was at Panama An-tonio Ezeta, who left her to recapture Salvador, came on board in all the glory

It was stated that an infraction of the law had once been made in the case of the battleship Oregon, which was lying on a mud bank, and that the money for the work had not yet been received. This work had been dote, it was stated, at the instance of Captain Hackett, of the California California Reclamation and Dredging Company, who was instrumental in having massed the law forbidding the state Company, who was instrumental in hav-ing passed the law forbidding the state to do any dredging outside of its own waters. The result of the decision of the board of harbor commissioners will be that the repairs to the Peking will have to be made at some port in China.
