MEETING OF CITY FATHERS.

Considerable Business Transacted by the Common Council Last Evening. CASINO GRANTED A LICENSE. After It Was Granted a Petition Was Read. Asking That Such License Be Not Granted—Law Regulating the Hours of All Minors.

The regular meeting of the common council was held last evening, all members being present. Quite a number of spectators were there, due, no doubt, to the fact that the petition of the Casino Theatre for a liquor license would be acted upon. This matter has been the subject of a considerable discussion of late, and the action of the council was awaited with much interest. The license was granted. No ladies were present. Applications for liquor licenses from Johnson & Carlson, A. Rauma, Frederick Westberg, J. W. O'Brien, Carlsson, and Evenson & Cook, were granted. The petition for a liquor license of D. Johnson, proprietor of the Casino, was read. The mayor, Mayor Taylor, in response to the petition, said that the license would be granted, but that the license would be subject to the action of the street committee. A petition from the tax payers residing in the neighborhood of Franklin avenue and Third Street for an electric light at the intersection of those streets, was referred to the street committee. A petition from the residents of Kensington avenue and Fifteenth street for an electric light, was referred to the same committee. A petition from D. Graham, asking that the property sold for delinquent taxes be returned to him was referred to the street committee. A communication from the property owners of Astor street, asking for the removal of a grade so that street, between Forty-fourth and Forty-sixth, was referred to the street committee. A communication from the auditor and public judge was read, stating that several warrants, among which was that of the public judge for \$6, had not been returned by the mayor. The mayor, in putting forth his reasons for not signing the warrants, said that as there were no funds for such appropriations, he could not comply with the check, and that such warrants would have to be waived. On motion, the action of the mayor was endorsed. Edward Brothers, of Portland, Oregon, presented a communication, asking if they could exhibit an animal and bird show in this city for less than the regular license fee of \$5 per day. The mayor requested that they be allowed to show their animals for \$2 per day. The council, on motion, recommended that the mayor be authorized to sign the license for the exhibition in Portland and could attend as to its instruction. The communication was referred to the committee on ways and means. In its action on a similar request, presented some years ago, the council allowed the exhibition to be held without a license, and it is thought the request of Edward Brothers will be granted. A communication from F. G. Schluck, of Portland, Or., including the amount of taxes on his property, was referred to the ways and means committee. A communication from A. J. Marsh, of Portland, Or., asking that the city execute a quit claim deed to Lot 12 Block 18, Shively's Astoria, on his title to which the city has a lien, was read, and referred to the committee on public property and the city attorney.
