THE LIGHTSHIP AND THE PILOTS.

If it is true that Commander Farenholt has issued an order forbidding the lightship to harbor pilots after discharging their vessels outside, it is to be hoped the Chamber of Commerce will take prompt steps to have it rescinded. There can be no possible harm to the government in this custom, since it is understood the pilots are more than willing to pay for their accommodations, and it is easy to see how the movement of shipping will be seriously crippled and the pilots themselves subjected to much unnecessary hardship if it is abolished.

What is the lightship there for if it is not for the benefit of commerce, and isn't the refuge these vessels are capable of affording, within reasonable bounds, to pilots who are prevented by stress of weather from rejoining their boats after putting ships to sea, almost as useful a service to commerce as the single function for which they were originally intended?
