The rain yesterday made the work of unloading disagreeable, but large awnings were rigged to protect the merchandise from getting wet, and chests of tea and Oriental morehandise were taken from the open hatches in unremit-ling streams. Of the freight which the ting streams. Of the freight which the Victoria brought to this part are 1,000 tons of general merchandise, 600 tons of tea and 250 bales of silk. Nearly all of this cargo is consigned East. The silk was forwarded last night. The three Japanese and one Chinaman who came over in the steerage will be examined this morning. In about six weeks the first of the new tee crop of China and Japan will be ready for shipment, and can her next trip East the Victoria will commente moving it. The crop this year is unusually good. The shipments of the product via the Northgrn Pacific stéamship line will be so heavy that the three steamers now on the route will not be able to move it fast enough. It is estimated that the quantity of tea which will come through the port of "acoma this season will be "ully id per cont greater than that of last year, when \$2,000 tons of tea were received and 50,000 tons of tea were received and shipped from here. The officers of the Victoria corroborate the statement pub-lished in the Ledger several days ago lished in the Ledger several days ago that two new steamers have been chartered by the Northern Pacific steamship company to run between Tacoma and Asiatic ports. The Victoria's purser said yesterday that the Olympic, one of the new vessels, is now on her way to China to load tea and merchandise. It is expected that the other vessel, which is believed to be named the Columbia, will be put on the route as soon as the shipment of the new tea crop is fairly under way. When the Olympic and Columbia come on the route the company will have five trans-Pacific steamers plying from Tacoma—Ledger.

Edward J.
