SOUND MONEY THE MAIN NECESSITY.

We copy in another column an interview given by George B. Roberts, president of the Pennsylvania company, in the New York Commercial Advertiser.

President Roberts is entirely right in saying that the one great source of our present business depression is the want of a sound money system so clearly declared that every country of the world would accept the credit of our people and government as established beyond dispute.

The time has come when the leaders of parties which expect to command the confidence of the country in the future must speak as President Roberts has spoken, and until it shall be done there will be continued depression in every channel of industry, commerce and trade.

TELLER A LITTLE MORE RATIONAL.

The Washington correspondent of a Chicago paper says Senator Teller has informed him that—

Free-silver Republicans will support the St. Louis committee if he be earnestly, heartily and sincerely in favor of international bimetalism and would work heartily to secure an international agreement.

If the senator is reported correctly he is climbing down from the high horse which he bestrode a few weeks ago in the senate when he voted against considering the tariff bill unless it had a free coinage amendment tacked to it.

Then he was not willing to wait for an international bimetallic agreement. He wanted the United States to go to coinage unlimited silver dollars at the rate of 16 to 1 without waiting for the co-operation of European nations or any one of them.

The senator may have found out within the last few weeks that he has not the backing at home he thought he had, and that the honest money platform which is going to be adopted at St. Louis will not be as many people to vote as he fancied.

There is not a Republican paper in the cities of Washington, Baltimore, Philadelphia, New York, Brooklyn, Boston, Pittsburgh, Cincinnati, St. Louis, Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul, Minneapolis, Kansas City or Omaha which does not put the money question ahead of the tariff as the most important pending political issue.

Every one of these papers is strongly against free silver. And yet there are politicians in the Republican party who say the money issue is a mere subterfuge invented by Democrats to divert attention from the tariff, and cause a split in the Republican party.

It would seem a little strange that the editors of all these great papers, many of whom have grown hoary headed, fighting the battles of the Republican party, before some of these astute politicians were old enough to vote, should be so easily taken in by such a transparent and obvious trick.

The Washington state militiamen are going entirely too far in their usurped control of the Columbia. What meat have these Cæsars fed upon that they have suddenly become so great? They are now maintaining practically a state blockade on the commerce of a large section of the Columbia river.

Surely Governor McGraw does not wish to produce a revolution here at the mouth of the Columbia, but this is certainly what will follow—
