peace Judge Abercrombie had a hard fight, C. H. Stockton and R. Humphreys running him closely.

The race for school superintendent was the closest of all, Mr. Smith having tied Miss Warren on the first ballot.

Punched heads and generally disgraced countenances, such as they have in Portland, were not in evidence, and the convention passed off harmoniously.

Republicans generally express satisfaction with the ticket, although there are some doubts as to the election of a few candidates.

Messrs. McGregor and Parker are both staunch gold standard men.

Considerable dissatisfaction was expressed last night over the nomination of Howell Lewis for the office of county commissioner.

The dissatisfaction generally was voted by delegates from the Nehalem, who claim that Mr. Lewis is a pronounced Populist, having forsaken the Republican party two years ago for the Populist, which, it is asserted, he thought would be victorious.

There were several other candidates for the office, but Mr. Lewis received a great deal larger vote than all the other aspirants.

Mr. Lewis' Populist tendencies will probably leave the office of county commissioner the weak spot on the Republican ticket.

By its declaration against silver the Republican party of Clatsop county greatly assists the honest money men in the state in the fight against the silver craze.

The state is almost equally divided on the money question, and this county's action will be the source of much satisfaction to those of sound money views.

Chairman Barker and Secretary Ridehalgh were highly complimented yesterday evening for the manner in which they presided over the convention.

Mr. Ridehalgh was especially congratulated and the delegates said he was the first secretary they had ever had whose voice could be heard all over the hall.
