SOUND MONEY HAS WON AT ST.

All the states and territories, except Alaska, to be represented at St. Louis in the national Republican convention have from adopted their platforms, and from these a perfectly trustworthy forecast may be made of the financial plank to be framed Thirty-three states and territories, rep-

resenting a total of 740 delegates, have pronounced unqualifiedly for the gold standard and against the free and unlimited coinage of silver at any ratio. Nine states and territories, representing a total of eighty-four votes in the convention, have adopted a free silver platform. Eight, including, Alabama, Piorida, Kansas, Louisiana, West Virginia, New Mexico, Oklahoma and the Indian territory, constituting a total of ninety-two votes, are doubtful. Adding

A favorable report has been ordered by the house committee on interstate and foreign commerce on the Mahon Nicaragua canal bill, as amended by the sub mmittee. As reported, the bill provides that the canal company shall have a capital stock of \$100,000,000, the shares to be non-assessable, and the number not to be increased except with the consent of congress. It provides that if the canal company shall, within nine months after the passage of the act, show that all the shares heretofore issued, except those issued to Nicaragua and Costa Rica, have been called in and canceled, the secretary of the treasury shall subscribe in behalf of the United States 700,000 shares (\$70,000,000) to the capital stock of the company in return for the guarantee of the bonds to be issued by the company. Ten thousand shares of stock shall also be issued to the holders of the stock surrendered. The director ate is to consist of eleven members, or each to be appointed by Nicaragua and Costa Rica, one by the canal company and eight by the president, with the advice and consent of the senate.
