## MATTERS MARINE.

## Movements of Vessels at Home and Elsewhere.

The steamer Signal is due today from Victoria. It is not known how many Chinese passengers she has.

The steamer Telephone yesterday afternoon reported the delivery of five boxes of fish to upriver canneries. It was also reported that Cook received five tons of fish the day before.

The steamer Empire arrived down the river yesterday. She has 200,000 feet of lumber for San Francisco from Portland and Kamukawa. It has not been decided when she will sail.

It is not generally known that the Cramps are obliged to carry an enormous amount of insurance on the vessel which are built in their shipyard for the government. No battleship has ever started on her trial trip without being heavily insured, and when several vessels are in course of construction at one time the sum amounts up into the millions. Edwin H. Cramp is authority for the statement that the battleship at one time carried \$12,000,000 insurance on government work. In fact, it is said that the Cramps were obliged to go to England in order to secure a man-of-war insurance, owing to the limitations of the American companies.

It will be impossible for the battleship Oregon to visit Portland on the Fourth of July ensuing, and, in fact, it was hardly expected that she would among those knowing the immense amount of detail work to be done on a man-of-war after she has been turned over to the government before the vessel is ready to be put in commission and in shape to go to sea as a member of the United States navy. Pilot W. H. Patterson, who was aboard the Oregon during her splendid performance in Santa Barbara channel, however, states that Admiral Boardley is willing to bring his flagship, the Philadelphia, to Portland any time during the summer the citizens of this city may desire that she should be immediately taken advantage of by the Fourth of July committee, and the Philadelphia is invited to visit Portland during the celebration. Nothing could add more to the day than the presence of this magnificent flagship, with her full complement of an admiral's crew, including band and extra marine guard. Also the disappointment in not having the Oregon here at that time will be lessened by the knowledge that the silver service with which it is intended to present the ship could not possibly be got ready at so early a date.—Telegraph.
