The amount for which the steamer Chitka (sailed this with a cargo of coal) was recently libeled has been paid by her owner, Mr. David Morgan.

The coasting bark Vidette arrived down from Portland yesterday and cleared for Redondo. She has a cargo of 100,000 feet of lumber and will probably sail tomorrow.

The British ship Porfarrshire, which sailed from this port March 17, with a cargo of grain for Alaska Bay, South Africa, was spoken May 7 in 36 south, 42 west.

The British four-masted bark Inverness-shire sailed yesterday for Liverpool with one of the biggest grain cargoes which has ever been shipped from this port.

The schooner Ella Johnson has been chartered by Captain Miner W. Bruce, and instead of carrying passengers to Cook inlet will take the captain's party of native Alaskans back to their northern home, and will then cruise along the coast of Siberia in search of reindeer to be transported to Alaska.

ETIQUETTE OF WHIST. Nine Little Rules for Card Players to Remember.

The established code of what etiquette contains the following rules, which were formulated to repress or prevent certain improper acts of conduct during the progress of the game, and which were adopted by the third American Whist Congress:

1. No conversation should be indulged in during the play, except such as is allowed by the rules of the game.

2. No player should in any manner convey any information as to the state of his mind, or of the chances, or of approval or disapproval of a play.

3. No player should lead until the preceding trick is turned and quitted.

4. No player should play a card in a winning card, draw a card from his hand for another lead until his partner has played for the current trick.

5. No player should play a card in any manner so as to call particular attention to it, nor should he demand that the attention of his partner be directed to it.

6. No player should purposely incur a penalty because he is willing to pay for it, nor should he make a second revoke in order to conceal a revoke already made.

7. No player should take advantage of information imparted by his partner through a breach of etiquette.

8. No player should refer to a disputed question of fact to a bystander who professes himself uninterested in the result of the game and able to decide the question.

9. Bystanders should not in any manner call attention to or give any intimation concerning the play or the state of the game during the play of a hand. They should not look over the hand of a player without permission, nor should they walk around the table to look at the cards in his hand.
