MATTERS MARINE.

Movements of Vessels at Home and Elsewhere.

The Albee Blanchard arrived down yesterday.

The Fernbach will not be down the river before Tuesday.

Four three-masted schooners were reported in the offing yesterday.

The Lurline is back on the Astoria route, after a brief lay-up for repairs.

The Rig Bonanza, expected yesterday, will probably arrive from Skamokawa early this morning.

The steamer State arrived from San Francisco Sunday morning with a large passenger list, including Co. H, Fifth Artillery, which will relieve the companies at present stationed at Port Canby.

The Sound papers that have been claiming for the vessel now building at Port Blakely the distinction of being the first five-masted schooner built on the Pacific coast are slightly in error, as the schooner Louis, with five "sticks" in her, was launched on Coos bay nearly ten years ago.

The British ship Blairmore was partly raised yesterday, says the San Francisco Commercial News. Her port rail and foremast were out of the water, and her starboard rail was entirely out of the mud. It is expected that today she will be towed to shallower water and placed on an even keel.

From advices received yesterday it is learned that the German five-masted ship Potos, the largest sailing ship afloat, built by Tecklenburg, at Geestemünde, Germany, for F. Laefer's Hamburg fleet in June, 1895, has, on her second voyage, made the trip from Hamburg to Iquique in 83 days, beating the record, which she held, by nine days.

The Dominion steamer Quadra returned from Rooke harbor yesterday afternoon, says the Colonist, where during her stay there three beams painted red were erected to show the fair way to the wharf on the western shore and one pile beacon painted black near Troilopi Point to show the channel leading to Rooke basin. The channel is very narrow and must be navigated with caution. In one place the channel is obstructed by a rock at low water, the channel being between this rock and the nearest shore, and the distance being 150 feet. On a tree opposite this rock Captain Walbram has placed a triangle painted white; this point must be kept close outward to clear the rock. Very fine weather was experienced during the Quadra's stay in the harbor. A salmon saltery is being erected on the eastern shore opposite the end of Whiffen spit. The salmon will be caught in the straits of Juan de Fuca.
