The following reminiscence of Cap-

tain Josiah N. Knowles, who died last week, appears in the book "Stories of the Sea," by Rev. E. E. Hale: "On Pebruary 9, 1858, Captain Knowleh sailed in the ship Wild Wave, from San Francisco, with a crew of 30, and ten passengers. The voyage was an une ventful one until March 5, when the ship went on a coral reef off Oeno Irland. The vessel was salling 13 knots an hour when 'breakers' were reported but the warning came too late, and she went head on. The ship was de serted and the land made by the shipwrecked mariners. A few days later Captain Knowles with five others took one of the ship's boats and started for Pitcairn Island, ninety miles south of the reef where the ship had struck Reaching that island, the captain found that it had been deserted, and that the inhabitants had left for Norfolk Island. While at Pitcairn's the boat in which the little crew had landed was smashed, and being fortunate in finding a number of tools left by the former inhabitants of the island Captain Knowles and the five men with him built a small vessel She was 30 feet long, 8 feet wide and 4 feet deep. She was schooner-rigged, and was a very crude affair, being made from timber hewn on the island and such lumber as could be found. The land, and they had to resort to the use of the axe.
